10 A.M.-2 P.M. MICHAEL SCHWARTZ LIBRARY SELF-GUIDED TOUR


Take a self-guided tour of the library to learn about its services, resources, technology and facilities. Library staff will be available to answer questions.


11 A.M. AND 12:30 P.M. ARTS CAMPUS TOUR
